Dear Friends

“Time flies, eternity waits.”

On the top of Queenstown Hill, overlooking a glorious vista straight out of the screenplay of “Lord of the Rings”, stands a spiralled steel sculpture, commissioned to celebrate the Millenium – the “Basket of Dreams”. It encourages those who stand beside it to reflect, both inward and outward – concluding with the final words of the inscription ... *“Time flies, eternity waits.”* We had much to reflect on that day, thousands of miles away from home in New Zealand, as we sought to come to terms with the sudden and unexpected news received that Phil’s mother had died. But even then, in the midst of deep sadness, there was a real comfort in the words on the hill and the hope they inspired. Following the famous words in the Old Testament Book of Ecclesiastes that there is a time for everything under heaven, we read: *“He has made everything*

beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the hearts of men...”

And as we reflected, we thanked God that there were no regrets – no feelings left unexpressed and no words uttered now wished unsaid – and not least at what was to be our final farewell before our trip. We had spent precious time together shortly before we left and we are truly grateful for the wealth of memories we cherish down the years.

I’m very aware, however, that this is not always possible for everyone for all kinds of different reasons – and sometimes through no fault of their own. And I make no judgements here. Sadly, relationships for some have become fraught with difficulties with little human remedy. But one of the things I have found saddest of all in my ministry is where members of families or friends have become divided and estranged – sometimes over many years – and time has finally run out!

In some cases, of-course, there is no estrangement at all – but the pressures and busyness of modern life have



meant visits or conversations between friends and family have become few and far between. Sometimes we all need a personal “Basket of Dreams” to cause us to stop, be still and reflect on what the most important priorities in our lives have become. Time does fly – and does sometimes run out!

The season of Lent is a traditional season of reflection and reminds us of the importance of keeping “short accounts” with God and with one another. But this isn’t meant to be a depressing or morbid activity – far from it! It’s actually all about the joy of forgiveness, reconciliation and the freedom

which the events of Good Friday and Easter make possible for us.

Let’s endeavour to make time for one another and all those we love this Lent, however we may choose to do so – so that, although time continues to fly, there may be far fewer, if any regrets!

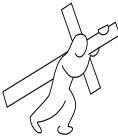

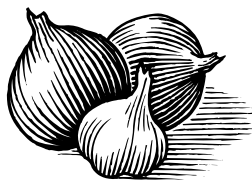

Parliamentary Constituency

When the General Election is declared, Appleton with Eaton will no longer be in the Wantage constituency but in Oxford West and Abingdon.

This boundary change came into force on June 27th 2007, but until this coming general election the old constituencies were used - very confusing!

The Oxford West and Abingdon constituency spreads from Carfax in the centre of Oxford to Appleton and Besselsleigh, also taking in Yarnton from Witney constituency. Therefore we change from being within a largely rural constituency to one with a mix of student, city, town and village.
