I once read a quote claiming that *“Every appeal to tradition is a resolve to drive using only the rear-view mirror.”* A trifle harsh, I think, although I would probably be amongst the first to say that empty ritual and traditions that have lost all real meaning are pointless in themselves.

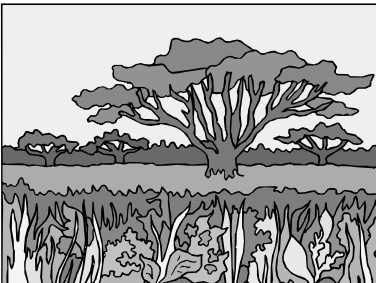
We live very much in an age of transition it appears – an age in which those who call themselves “traditionalists” feel much at odds with the post-modern ethos of much of life today which declares that everything is up for grabs – there are no longer any certainties and everything is open to question. Quite a refreshing attitude in many ways and one which most children and students in our schools and universities are extremely familiar with – but as always, we can so easily find ourselves throwing the “baby out with the bath water” unless we’re careful!!

Whilst valuing and learning the lessons from it, we certainly can’t

live in the past. But traditions continue to have their place whenever we inhabit them anew and find they have fresh relevance to our individual and corporate lives.

Some “traditions” are not as ancient as others of-course. One such is the “Ascension Day Walk” by the pupils and staff of our local primary school through the woods and across to St. Lawrence Church, Besselsleigh and back. I’m delighted that this tradition was begun by one of our eminent former Rectors, Paul Tuckwell, about forty years ago. I’m told by Paul’s daughters, Patty and Mary, that it originally took the form of a whole day’s ramble and leisurely picnic, Paul setting a path through woodland and countryside – sadly not something that today’s Health and Safety measures would easily endorse – let alone “Safeguarding Children”! But how thankful we are that this tradition still remains in its present form – and great fun we all have, too, crossing the stiles and admiring the beautiful carpet of bluebells, as the two Year Six pupils who have gone on ahead ring out the bells of St. Lawrence, calling us to our impromptu little Service celebrating Christ’s ascension, crammed into every corner of this little Parish church.

Another “tradition”, as such, that we are very grateful that Paul Tuckwell introduced is the “Appleton with Eaton Advertiser.” What a contribution this has made over so many years to the life of the whole community here. It has adapted to change, of course – and in recent times has additionally found its way “on-line” as part of our village website. And



after three months now of its “new look” introduced by its new editor, may we take this opportunity of thanking Pippa for all her hard work thus far, with thanks also to Nick Withers and all the distribution team. The new look “Advertiser” has been greatly admired and appreciated across the village as we have seen another Appleton “tradition” enter another new phase.

Last August we departed from tradition, however, and with grateful thanks to Andre and Heidi, celebrated the Festival of St. Laurence with a picnic and open-air Songs of Praise in the garden of “The Plough”. Sixty people came along on that occasion and joined in with gusto! We will be repeating this again on Sunday afternoon, August 8th. I hope that some of our Village organisations may be able to take part in some way. But if you have a particular favourite song or hymn that you would like included – traditional or otherwise! – please let me know – leave a note at the Rectory or in Church or speak to me directly! Who knows, perhaps another “new” tradition will begin!

Some things inevitably evolve and change – but the most important truths are timeless! The writer of the New Testament book of Hebrews emphasises one such in reminding us that: *“Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and for ever.”*

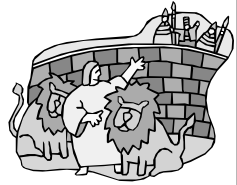

committee meeting. The Group are making the
following points about the weir:

- ◆ The cost - it is a waste of public money
which in these times of cutbacks could be
better spent elsewhere.
- ◆ The proposed work to address the flood,
and Health and Safety concerns is based on
insubstantial evidence.
- ◆ The EA Report says: Northmoor Weir: *'The
River Thames Paddle and Rymer Weir
Replacement Project - Heritage Review
(Michael Trueman 2008) considers
Northmoor and Rushey as the best
examples of paddle and rymer weirs that
fully span the river. ...[Northmoor] is of
historical interest due to its place as an
integral visual part of the station group
alongside the relatively unaltered 1895 lock
house and lock, which the review
recommended are given a grade II listing.'*

The WAG is setting up sub-groups to look at
the issues and areas of concern.

We shall be organising a petition, writing letters,
contacting government etc. Further details will

Feedback from the Community Plan

Many people commented about the shop and offered some useful suggestions - we have noted all your comments and would like to reply to a few each month.

➤ Organic bread, milk, fruit and vegetables: the shop bakes white and brown organic bloomers daily - if you would like to ensure that you get one regularly why not order one, please ask at the counter. We sell one litre bottles of fresh organic milk from Dairy Crest. Our supplier gets us local fruit and vegetables when he can; local people bring their produce when in season and we are very willing buy from them. We had rhubarb recently.

➤ Vegetable box scheme - this would be nice to do - is there anyone willing to set up and run a scheme?

➤ Local meats - we buy our fresh meat from Field Farm Fresh in Appleton - they deliver when it is needed (usually twice a week): if you would like a specific joint we can order it just let us know a couple of days before. We also have bacon, sausages, pate, haslet, black pudding etc. from Dews Meadow Farm at East Hanney. Our ham comes from Michael Caine at Cumnor who cooks it.
