Dear Friends

I wonder how you would define the "Church"? Perhaps if that's too wide a question, it might be easier to bring it closer to home and ask how you would describe the Church here in Appleton. I would expect to receive some pretty wide-ranging answers – not least arising from people's personal experience - or none - of the Church both here and in other places, too.

The recent Community Plan Questionnaire gives us a good measure of response in that it records that 412 village residents value the Church as a community asset – 224 value the Church building, 130 value it as a place to worship God and 75 as a place to pray and meditate.

Of course the Christian Church is essentially all about **people** and not buildings – St. Paul describes the Church in terms of a human body – with every part making up the whole in its own unique God-given way – but Church buildings, themselves, especially where they have stood for hundreds of years in the centre of community remain very special



places and Appleton and Besselsleigh churches are very good examples. We are very fortunate at Appleton in being able to have a beautiful Church which is open every day. And, in addition to those who attend regular worship, many visit and find quietness, strength and assurance and not least from within the Prayer Corner where Barbara Payne and Patty Tuckwell seek to provide creative and seasonal resources to inspire and to help bring home to us God's love and presence in ways relevant to our own needs. Hundreds of years of prayer and worship have helped to make St. Laurence the special place it is and it's so encouraging to read the words left in the visitors' book by one of our village children: *"It's a wonderful place to be, especially because it's quiet. I really enjoy being here because it feels like home and very cosy."*

August 10th is the date we remember our patronal saint – St. Laurence. It's not the easiest time of the year in the middle of summer with so many people away on holiday but it's so important to continue to celebrate and give thanks for the heritage we have received and the love and

faithfulness of God to our community here. And this year, as last, we bring that thanksgiving right into the centre of the village by kind courtesy of Andre and Heidi as we celebrate together with Songs of Praise in the garden of The Plough on Sunday 8th August. Different groups and organisations in the village are each choosing a hymn and we are very much hoping this will be a Service that truly reflects the special community we share. Can anyone take a guess at the popular hymn that the Gardening Club has already chosen? We warmly invite everyone who can to come and join us and to share in the refreshments afterwards – and The Plough remains open throughout.

You know, too many of us make all sorts of easy – and wrong – assumptions at times about things that we have never really experienced for ourselves – and that includes the Church and the God we believe in and seek to serve here. It's been said that you quickly lose interest in the church if you have nothing invested! Think about it!

I leave the final word to Jesus, himself! "*Come and see!*" (John 1:39)

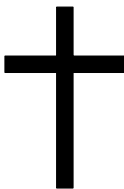

The Weir Action Group has studied all the documentation which is available relating to the proposed development of the weir. The following letter has been delivered to most houses in the village and many of you have signed it - thank you very much. If you do not have a copy they are available from the shop. If you have one please could you sign it and return it to the shop. Thank you to everyone for their help and support.

Dear David Cameron

We, the undersigned, believe that the replacement by the Environment Agency of the Paddle & Rymer weir at Northmoor lock in your constituency should be stopped.

We believe

- ◆ it is inappropriate to spend c £2.9 million in the current economic climate
- ◆ that the Health & Safety issues concerning the operation of the weir have been overstated and may become obsolete in Lord Young's upcoming review
- ◆ water management benefits from an automated weir have also been overstated (the maximum number of properties affected is 8). The money assigned to this project could be better spent in flood prevention elsewhere in the area.
- ◆ insufficient consideration has been given to the heritage value of the 'station group' (house, lock & weir) at Northmoor
- ◆ alternative low impact and cheaper technology as a way of assisting the weir operators has not been given appropriate consideration by the E.A.
- ◆ the environmental impact of doing this work has not been properly studied (possibly 1000 vehicle movements)
- ◆ despite consultation meetings the E.A. has inadequately appreciated the dangers to the residents of Appleton, during the two summers construction period

We would appreciate your URGENT consideration of this issue.

We enclose fuller documentation of our objections.
